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Charm City Fringe Announces 2018 Festival Lineup, Second Year in the Bromo Arts District

Passes now available for 20+ shows, 80+ performances Nov. 1-11

SEPTEMBER 19, 2018. BALTIMORE, MD – [Charm City Fringe](http://charmcityfringe.com) announces the line-up for the seventh annual festival, now in its second year in the Bromo Arts District. Charm City Fringe will present 23 productions and over 80 performances during the 11-day festival from Nov. 1 to 11.

Charm City Fringe features performers from all over North America presenting new and experimental work. The festival features 13 productions by Maryland artists, nine from other states, and one from Canada. Shows include a comedy about Hillary Clinton immediately following the 2016 election, a tribute to French and German cabaret during the Nazi years of the late 1930s, an adult variety show starring Get Out Magazine's LGBT Comedian of the Year Ike Avelli, and a comedic Victorian circus spectacular. Festival venues are conveniently located within three blocks in the Bromo Arts District, with the newly opened Le Mondo space serving as the Charm City Fringe headquarters and location of Fringe After Dark performances and parties.
